Thailand is one of the world's most dynamic economic countries. Due to soaring energy demand the search for cost-effective alternatives is becoming increasingly important. Environmental and climate change concerns are reinforcing this development.

Energy conservation plays an important role in strengthening energy security, alleviating household expenditure, reducing production and services costs, reducing trade deficit and increasing the competitive edge, including reduction of pollution and greenhouse gases (GHG) which cause global warming and climate change. Therefore, energy conservation policy has been a priority of the Thai government; the Ministry of Energy has developed a 20-year Energy Efficiency Development Plan (2011-2030) to provide the national policy framework and guidelines on energy conservation implementation in the long term.

The Thai-German Forum on Energy Efficiency in Thai Industries Conference is organized with the objectives to present various aspects in related to project development as seen below.

- To address energy efficiency potential in Thailand and existing barriers.
- To introduce state-of-the-art energy efficiency technologies for energy intensive industry sectors.
- To identify market opportunities for energy efficiency services and products.
- To establish close cooperation among participants and German companies for future energy efficiency networks

It is expected that after the conference participants will be able to take part in high quality and standard for project development in the area of energy efficiency which will be further gained knowledge and awareness during the conference.
